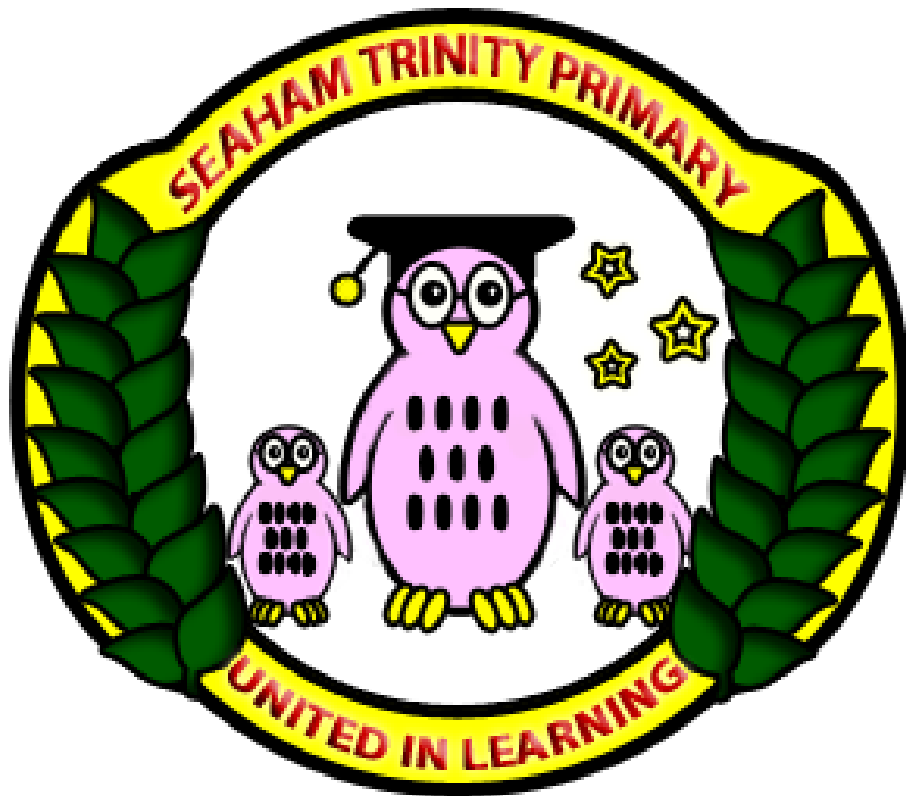

Year 6 Autumn Term 2024

This term your child will be completing tasks and activities on the following topics.

English	We will cover all aspects of Speaking and Listening, Reading and Writing, with additional focus on writing descriptively at length. This term, our class novels will be 'Holes' by Louis Sachar and 'Wonder' by R. J. Palacio. We will link our English work to both of these and produce a variety of writing including: biographies of key figures; newspaper reporting; diaries and poetry. Additional focus shall be given to spelling and grammar throughout the term, along with guided and reciprocal reading.
Maths	Across school we follow the CPA (concrete, pictorial, abstract) approach to maths. By Year 6 we are mainly focusing on pictorial and abstract questions in preparation for SATs. This term the areas of maths we will be focusing on are: Place value; Addition, subtraction, multiplication and division; Fractions and Converting units. Throughout these topics we will be applying our knowledge to SATs style problem solving questions.
History	This term our History focus is ' How has the justice system in Britain changed over time? ' <i>Our key learning questions are:</i> <ul style="list-style-type: none">- What do we mean by crime and punishment?- What did the Romans believe about crime and punishment?- How did the legal system work in Anglo-Saxon Britain?- How was law and order established in Medieval Britain?- Were the Tudors torturous?- Was the Highwayman a hero or a villain?- How did the Victorians influence our justice system today?- How did World War 2 impact the roles of police officers?- How has the justice system in Britain changed over time?
Science	<u>Animals including humans</u> Children will identify and name the main parts of the human circulatory system, and describe the functions of the heart, blood vessels and blood. They will recognise the impact of diet, exercise, drugs and lifestyle on the way their body's function and describe the ways in which nutrients and water are transported within animals, including humans. They will learn how to keep their bodies healthy and how their bodies might be damaged – including how some drugs and other substances can be harmful to the human body. As scientists, children will conduct investigations to further their scientific knowledge and deepen their understanding of theories and principles. Children will research a prominent scientist from this field.
Computing	During online safety we will be focusing on Media Balance and Wellbeing – Finding my media balance in Autumn 1 and Cyberbullying – Is it cyberbullying? In Autumn 2 In computer programming, Autumn 1, the children will focus on Computer Systems and Networks, moving onto Creating Media – Web Page Creation in Autumn 2
Geography	In Geography our topic is - Fantastic Forests – Why are they so important? <i>Our key learning questions are:</i> <ul style="list-style-type: none">- Can you find the connection and find the location?- Where are the world's great forests?- What forests and woodland do we have in the UK?

	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - What can we find in our local forest/woodland? - What do forests do? - Why is the Amazon Rainforest so important? - What are forests in Danger - How can we protect our forests in the UK?
Design Technology	The design technology focus this term is – Electrical systems and computing: more complex switches and circuits. The children will control IT/Traffic light system. This links with our science topic – Electricity.
Art and Design	Our Art focus is Drawing. We will be looking at the technique of one point perspective. The children will then apply this to their study of local artist Norman Cornish and his 'Pitmen Painters' commissions. Our Christmas craft focus will be Cross Stitch.
Music	Throughout school we will be using the music resource Charanga to aid out teaching of Music. Our topic is titled Happy Classroom Jazz 2. As in the title, our unit focuses around the Pharrell Williams song Happy from Despicable Me 2. Private music lessons will continue this term: Monday – Guitar with Mr. Charlton Wednesday – Brass with Mr. Hind
RE	Across the Autumn term the children will learn about religious diversity in their local area. With a focus on Rituals in different religions. At Christmas time the focus will be on what the gospels tell us about the birth of Jesus – studying the gospels according to Luke and John, comparing the similarities and differences in their telling over the birth of Jesus.
PE	In Autumn 1 we will be focusing on Netball skills on a Monday and Cricket skills on a Friday. In Autumn 2 the children will be focusing on Tag Rugby skills as well as going swimming once a week.
PSHE/RSE	The three areas of PSHE we will study this term are as follows: Belonging to a community - valuing diversity; challenging discrimination and stereotypes Families and Friendships - Attraction to others; romantic relationships; civil partnerships and marriage Respecting ourselves and others - Expressing opinions and respecting other points of view, including discussing topical issues

You could help your child at home by:

- Helping and encouraging them to complete homework tasks;
- Visiting the library to borrow books on topics;
- Using the internet, with parental supervision, to research topics;
- Encouraging them to read and write as often as possible and giving assistance with spelling and punctuation where needed.
- Helping the children to practise their multiplication tables.
