Fine motor There will be a focus on hand strength exercises and wrist movements to support children's use a range of small tools, including scissors, paintbrushes and cutlery. Gross motor Revise and refine fundamental movement skills they have already acquired including rolling, crawling, walking, jumping, running, hopping, skipping and climbing. Big scale activities outdoors to cover a large surface such as painting.









